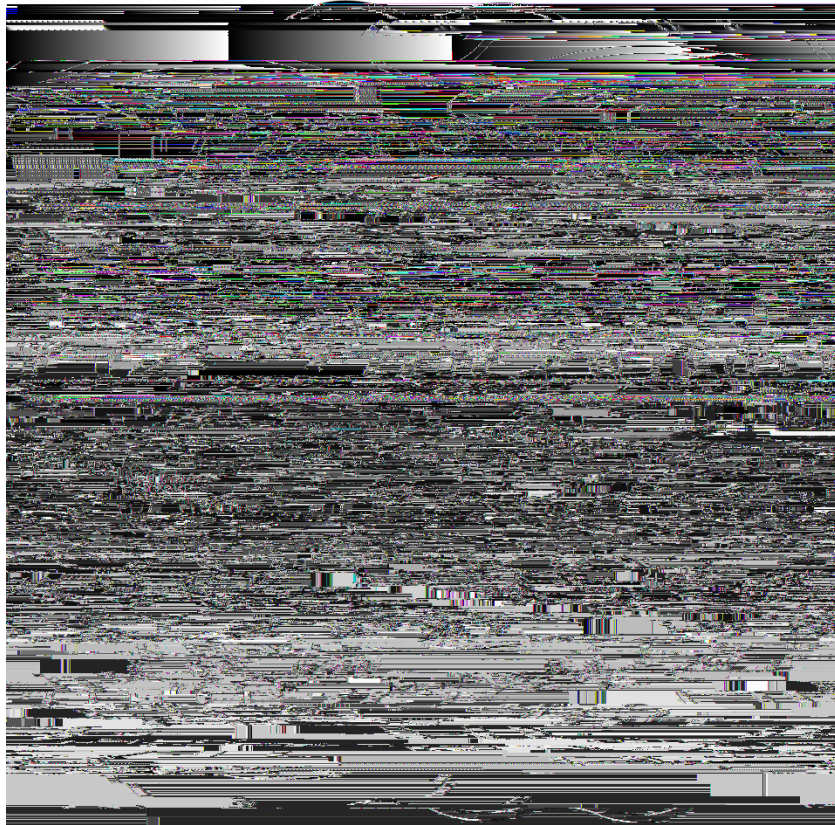

Mission Statement

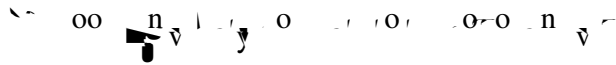
The mission of Oakwood University, a historically black, Seventh-day Adventist institution, is to transform students through biblically-based education for service to God and humanity.

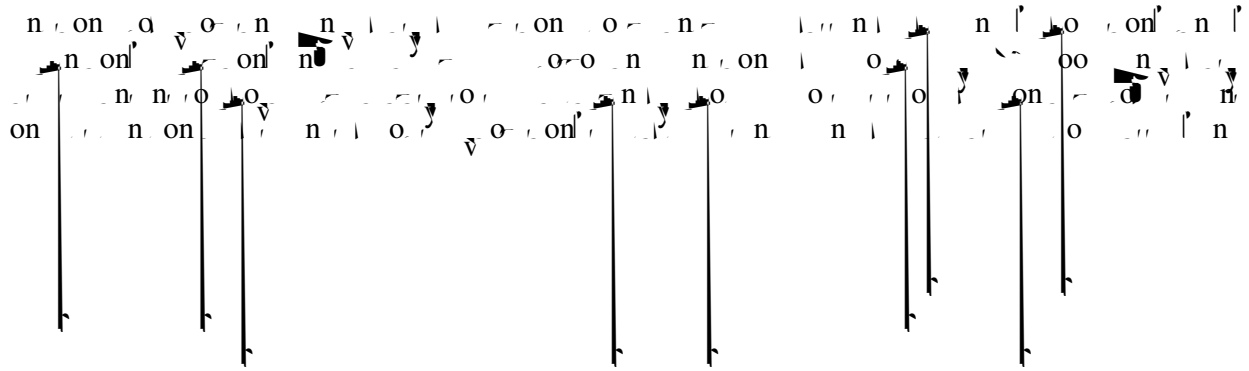


Expulsion: An expulsion will be noted on the student's permanent record (transcript).

1 Dismissal: A dismissal will be noted on the student's permanent record (transcript).

11 Repeat Violations: A student who has been suspended or expelled for a violation of the Code of Student Conduct and who is subsequently suspended or expelled for the same or a different violation within a specified period of time shall be considered to have committed repeat violations. A student who is found to have committed repeat violations shall be subject to the sanctions set forth in this policy.

12 Sanctions Related to Group Behavior: A student who is found to have committed a violation of the Code of Student Conduct that involves the behavior of a group shall be subject to the sanctions set forth in this policy.

Dining Hall/Market Rules of Conduct and Decorum

Dining Hall/Market Rules

1. A student must have a valid student identification card. Students may not use another's card for entrance into the Dining Hall/Market.
2. A student must adhere to the Dining Hall/Market Code of Conduct. Students must not use profane or vulgar language, engage in physical altercations, or use weapons.
3. A student must not consume alcohol in the Dining Hall/Market. Students must not use tobacco products, including e-cigarettes, in the Dining Hall/Market.
4. A student must not bring outside food or beverages into the Dining Hall/Market. Students must not use the Dining Hall/Market for any unauthorized purpose.

Enforcement

Infraction of any of the above "rules of conduct and decorum" will result in a suspension from the Dining Hall/Market.

Citizenship Review

A student who is suspended from the Dining Hall/Market for a second time will be referred to the Dean's Office for a Citizenship Review. The Dean's Office will determine if the student should be suspended from the University.

A student who is suspended from the Dining Hall/Market for a third time will be referred to the Dean's Office for a Citizenship Review. The Dean's Office will determine if the student should be suspended from the University. A student who is suspended from the Dining Hall/Market for a fourth time will be referred to the Dean's Office for a Citizenship Review. The Dean's Office will determine if the student should be suspended from the University.

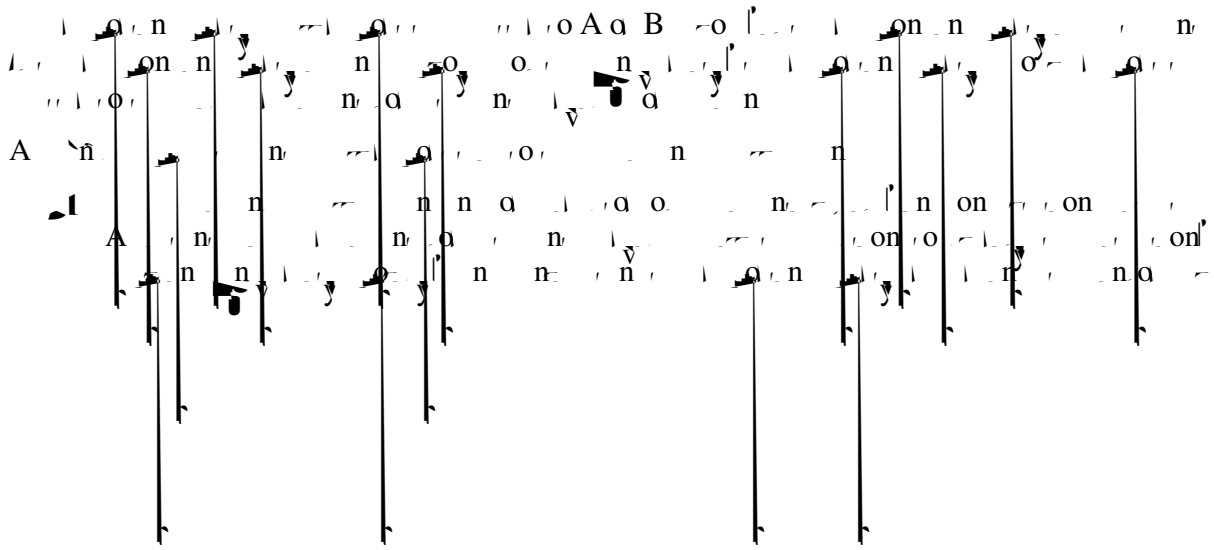


